Government have raised the age of marriage but Banke has the highest teenage pregnancy rate with complications. The youngest of ectopic pregnancy in our institute was 14 years last year! Our DHS data has shown such fantastic improvement in terms of MMR, ANC coverage and so on. If we analyze province wise Lumbini, Karnali are the worst in terms of improvement.

Where have we gone wrong then?

We are producing... tons of medical graduates, specialists in Obs/GYN and yet rural areas there are not enough health care workers. It is not just due to unavailability of health care workers and timely management we are still losing young mothers but also because there is need of timely supply of essential drugs, strengthening referral mechanisms, emergency transport, health awareness and education which are also equally important to uplift women's health.

For these reasons, we need more original articles of your research work which focus on women health and status and create awareness and bring changes in clinical practice. Nothing more is convincing than evidence based medicine. As the slogan goes "sharing is caring" Please share with us your research, so that our medical community can benefit the maximum. Our young members also get an opportunity to showcase their scientific research/writing talents and learn from each other.
